BOOKS FOR BABIES

On their first birthday, each child in Pond Inlet will receive a gift of two picture books (one in Inuktitut and one in English), a finger puppet and a library tote bag. This project hopes to instill a positive attitude towards books and build reading readiness skills during this critical early learning phase.



HEALTHY TEETH

This project will give each two-year old in Pond Inlet a birthday present of books about visiting the dentist (one in English and one in Inuktitut) plus a toothbrush and a tube of toothpaste. The gift bag also includes information about the importance of regular brushing of children's teeth and healthy food choices. The oral hygiene of many preschool children in Pond Inlet is poor. The aim of the project is to help children and their parents understand the need for good dental care from an early age.



DAY CARE SUPPORT

Grants from the Foundation this year were used to build a security fence around a playground and to purchase arts and crafts supplies for the day care centres in Pond Inlet.



BOAT SAFETY

Although boating safety is of vital importance in Pond Inlet many families cannot afford to provide different sizes of survival suits and life vests for their children as they grow. This project will fund the purchase of forty life vests in sizes ranging from infant to youth. Colouring books and boat-safety pamphlets produced by the Canadian Coast Guard will be distributed with the life vests.

ON-GOING PROGRAMS

Each June the Foundation provides prizes for students at the Nasivvik High School. In 2008, a total of \$8,000 was awarded to students in grades 9-12 in recognition of their attendance, effort, attitude and academic achievement. As well, this year three students traveling south for postsecondary studies received bursaries.

Building on the very successful Fiddle Workshop held in 2007, a similar event took place in May 2008 involving participants from 2007 and some new budding musicians.

Last year the foundation helped Pond Inlet student Alexandra Anaviapik attend the Nunavut Sivuniksavut program in Ottawa. Nunavut Sivuniksavut is an eightmonth college program designed to help Inuit youth prepare for educational, training, and career opportunities.

As part of the program Alexandra and her fellow students visited Mongolia. A highlight of the trip was visiting the Tsaasan (Reindeer People) who travel with herds of reindeer (called tuktu) throughout the forested areas of Mongolia, near the border with Siberia.
